Submissions of complete sections devoted to specific topics are possible. Notification of acceptance (or rejection) will be sent in mid October. Presenters may be asked to serve as discussants.

Because the conference also serves as a local job market in economics, the early-stage researchers and job market candidates are particularly encouraged to submit their best work.
